About his conversion

About the motivation for preaching

So, Who is St Patrick?

St Patrick's Day is a Saint's day – but who was Patrick?

There's the history and there's the legends.

Here's a quick history of Patrick

- Born and raised in Britain
(That's right he wasn't Irish!)
- Born around 390AD into a Christian family
- His father was a deacon; his grandfather a priest
(That's right, a married priest!)
- Kidnapped into slavery by Irish aged 16
- Worked as a shepherd slave in East Antrim for 6 years
- Converted to Christianity while in slavery
(That's right, he needed to be born again)
- Escaped back to home in Britain where he trained for ministry
- Returned permanently to Ireland around 432AD
- Spent 30 years a missionary, preaching the gospel
(That's right, preaching to convert people!)
- Baptized thousands, ordained clergy and negotiated with tribal chiefs
- Met fierce opposition and persecution
- Saw Ireland changing from paganism to Christ
- Died around 460AD
(17th March is traditionally celebrated as the day he died)
